endure (v.)

Definitions

1. to continue to exist; to last for a period of time
2. to deal with or accept something unpleasant for a long time

Sample Sentences

1. The Greek temple has endured for thousands of years.
2. The Greek temple endured many attempts to destroy it.

fortune





fortune (n.)

Definitions


1. good or bad luck
2. wealth; riches

Sample Sentences

1. He had the good fortune to find the treasure.
2. He hoped the treasure map would lead him to a fortune.

heroic





heroic (adj.)

Definition


having or showing great courage

Sample Sentence

The city welcomed the heroic woman.

illuminate





illuminate (v.)

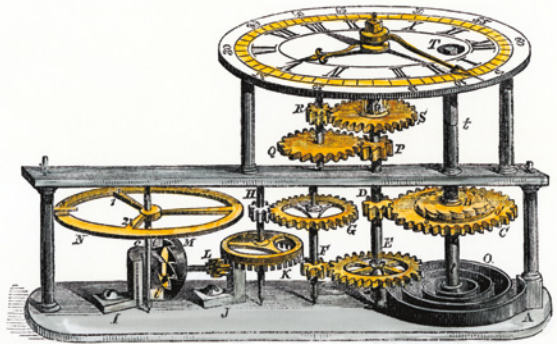
Definitions


1. to shine a light on something
2. to make something clear and easier to understand

Sample Sentences

1. The sunlight illuminated the statue.
2. The teacher added notes to illuminate the difficult task.

invention





invention (n.)

Definitions

1. a useful new device or process
2. the act of creating something new

Sample Sentences

1. The clock was a new invention to keep track of time.
2. Creativity and invention helped people develop the clock.

muse





muse (n.)

Definition

a source of inspiration, especially for a poet

Sample Sentence

The muse inspired the writer to draft a new poem.

myth

myth (n.)

Definition

a story that was told in an ancient culture to explain a practice, belief, or natural occurrence

Sample Sentence

Long ago, the Greeks told myths about gods and goddesses to explain the world around them.

nemesis





nemesis (n.)

Definitions

1. a source of harm or ruin
2. an opponent that cannot be beaten or overcome

Sample Sentences

1. Hurricane season is a nemesis for people living by the ocean.
2. The cat was the dog's nemesis.

story





story (n.)

Definitions

1. a description of imaginary events that is told as a form of entertainment
2. a description of how something happened

Sample Sentences

1. The story was a fairytale from long ago.
2. The teacher told the story of how the school got its name.

victory





victory (n.)

Definition

defeat of an enemy or opponent

Sample Sentence

The Greeks honored the athlete's victory by crowning him with a laurel wreath.
