adversity (n.)

Definition

a difficult situation or condition; misfortune or tragedy

Sample Sentence

The farmer faced adversity when the corn crop died.

depression



depression (n.)

Definition

a period of time in which there is little economic activity and many people do not have jobs

Sample Sentence

During the Great Depression, many people stood in line to get free food.

devastating (adj.)

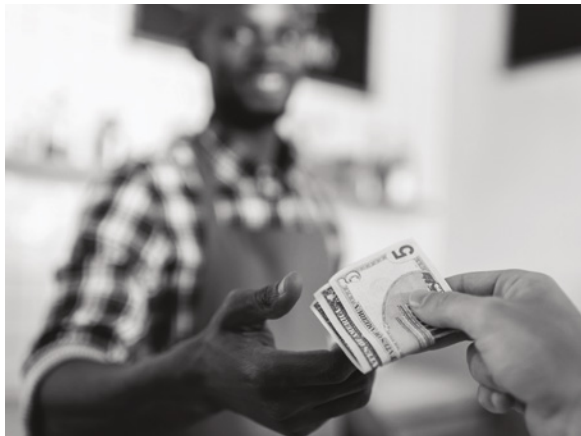
Definition

causing great damage or harm

Sample Sentence

A devastating dust storm threatened the town.

economy



economy (n.)

Definition

the process or system by which people produce, sell, and buy goods and services in a country or region

Sample Sentence

People can buy more goods when the economy is strong.

hardship



hardship (n.)

Definition

pain and suffering

Sample Sentence

The family worked together to overcome hardships after the storm.

levity



levity (n.)

Definition

a lack of seriousness; an amusing quality

Sample Sentence

People enjoyed the musicians' levity.

migrate (v.)

Definition

to move from one country or place to live or work in another

Sample Sentence

The family migrated to another state to find work.

perseverance



perseverance (n.)

Definition

the quality that allows someone to continue trying to do something even though it is difficult

Sample Sentence

The family showed perseverance in the face of difficulty.

resilience



resilience (n.)

Definition

the ability to become strong, healthy, or successful again after something bad happens

Sample Sentence

The new crop of corn grew high because of the land's resilience.

transient



transient (adj.)

Definition

staying somewhere only a short time

Sample Sentence

Some transient populations of people rode trains to travel from place to place.
